THE NEWSPAPER INDEX

Now that you have information about ants' nests from books and encyclopedias, let's see if you can find information from a newspaper. Is there anything in your library about ants?


Maybe your library has more than one newspaper. Do you read each one cover to cover? Let's look at one newspaper. How do you check the newspaper for this information? You check the index.

Every newspaper has an index. Look at the inside of the front page. There is a list of articles and columns. These are in alphabetical order.

What is an article? It is a newspaper story. What is a column? It is a short article written regularly. Often it is written by the same person. You will find the articles and columns in sections of the newspaper. The newspaper is divided into parts or sections. Each section is given a letter. The subjects are listed alphabetically by section. The page number will follow the section letter. Let's say you choose a Sunday newspaper. There is a science section in the newspaper. Its letter is S, look under S in the index. It should look like this—S Science Today.

Animals in Our Environment	S	87
Let's Look at the Stars	S	91

You are in luck. Turn to page 94 in the S section. Now let's look closely at the newspaper index and learn how to use it.
